Event Honors State Rep. Aaron Michlewitz and Nancy Huntington Stager of Eastern Bank Foundation; Raises

Critical Funds for Early Education Programs in South End, Jamaica Plain

**BOSTON** (Nov. 3, 2023) – Ellis Early Learning raised over \$630,000 to support its nonprofit mission and honored two champions of early childhood education, state Rep.
